

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

P Centuries before the birth of Jesus, the people of God longed and waited for the Messiah. This King to come would rule with justice, establish peace, restore life, and bring his people Joy. In conquering the powers of sin, death, and the devil Jesus has opened to us the gates of heaven and has given us the hope of resurrection. In joy we celebrate by lighting the third candle of the Advent wreath. We read in Luke:

And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger. Luke 2:8-12

We will light the third candle as we sing the third verse of "Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel"

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P Whenever we gather for the celebration of Holy Communion, we hear again the wonderful story of God's mighty acts, and of the love shown to us in the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. With thanksgiving, we remember that in the night in which He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying: *Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.*

- P Again, after supper, He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.
- ^P For as often as we eat of this bread and drink of this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death, until he comes.
- ^C Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- ^p Therefore, gracious Father, with this bread and cup we remember the life our Lord offered for us. And, believing the witness of his resurrection, we await his coming in power to share with us the great and promised feast.
- ^C Amen. Come, Lord Jesus
- ^P Send now we pray, your Holy Spirit, the spirit of our Lord and of His resurrection, that we who receive the Lord's body and blood may live to the praise of your glory and receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.
- ^C Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.
- ^P We are given assurance of our Lord's presence through the gift of His Holy Spirit. Now, we receive this same bread of life and this same cup of blessing, that we may be strengthened through these gifts.
- ^P Let us pray: Almighty Father, whose dear Son instituted the Sacrament of his Body and Blood: Mercifully grant that we may receive it thankfully in remembrance of Jesus Christ our Lord, who in these holy mysteries gives us a pledge of eternal life; and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. ^C **Amen**
