### PSALMODY PSALM 51:1-17

A: Please join in the responsive reading of Psalm 51

A: <sup>1</sup>Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

C: <sup>2</sup>**Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!**

A: <sup>3</sup>For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

C: <sup>4</sup>**Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.**

A: <sup>5</sup>Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.

C: <sup>6</sup>**Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart.**

A: <sup>7</sup>Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

A: <sup>13</sup>Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.

**C: <sup>14</sup>Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness.**

A: <sup>15</sup>O LORD, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.

**C: <sup>16</sup>For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering.**

A: <sup>17</sup>The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

**C: Glory to the Father, ✠ and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen**

#### EXHORTATION

P: Brothers and sisters: God created us to experience joy in communion with Him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with His creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. Also, by our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under His judgment, but to turn to Him and live. As disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, and works of love help us to wage our spiritual warfare. We invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to this struggle and confess your sins, asking our Father for strength to persevere in your Lenten Discipline.

*Silence for reflection and self-examination*

#### CONFESSION

P: Most Holy and merciful Father:

**C: We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.**

P: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven. **C: Have mercy on us, Lord.**

P: We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

**C: Have mercy on us, Lord.**

P: We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness. The pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives, **C: We confess to you, Lord.**

P: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, **C: We confess to you, Lord.**

P: Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves, **C: We confess to you, Lord.**

P: Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work, **C: We confess to you, Lord.**

P: Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us, **C: We confess to you, Lord.**

P: Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

**C: Accept our repentance, Lord.**

P: For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

**C: Accept our repentance, Lord.**

P: For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,

**C: Accept our repentance, Lord.**

P: Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us.

**C: Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great.**

#### THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

P: You are invited to come forward, and if you are able, kneel before the altar. If you are unable to kneel, you can stand. At the altar rail the sign of the cross will be marked on your forehead with ashes. After you have received the sign of repentance and mortality, and after your prayer at the altar rail, you can return to your seat for the continuance of our worship service.

#### AFTER ASHES PRAYER

P: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of Your Salvation,

**C: That we may show forth Your glory in the world.**

P: By the cross and Passion of Your Son, our Lord,

**C: Bring us with all Your saints to the joy of His resurrection.** *(pause)*

P: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live.

Therefore, we implore Him to grant us true repentance and His Holy Spirit, that those things may please Him which we do on this day, that the rest of our life may be pure and holy, and that at the last we may come to His eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**C: Amen**

**FIRST READING JOEL 2:12-19**

L: The first reading is from Joel, the second chapter.

<sup>12</sup>"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; <sup>13</sup>and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. <sup>14</sup>Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? <sup>15</sup>Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; <sup>16</sup>gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. <sup>17</sup>Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'" <sup>18</sup>Then the LORD became jealous for his land and had pity on his people. <sup>19</sup>The LORD answered and said to his people,

“Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.”

L: This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

**SECOND READING 2 CORINTHIANS 5:20B-6:10**

L: The second reading is from second Corinthians, the fifth chapter.

<sup>20b</sup>We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. <sup>21</sup>For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. <sup>1</sup>Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. <sup>2</sup>For he says, “In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you.” Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. <sup>3</sup>We put no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, <sup>4</sup>but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, <sup>5</sup>beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; <sup>6</sup>by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; <sup>7</sup>by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; <sup>8</sup>through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; <sup>9</sup>as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; <sup>10</sup>as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

L: This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God!**

**THE HOLY GOSPEL MATTHEW 6:1-6, 16-21**

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the sixth Chapter.

**C: Glory to You, O Lord.**

<sup>1</sup>[Jesus said,} “Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. <sup>2</sup>Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. <sup>3</sup>But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, <sup>4</sup>so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. <sup>5</sup>And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. <sup>6</sup>But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

<sup>16</sup>“And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. <sup>17</sup>But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, <sup>18</sup>that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. <sup>19</sup>Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, <sup>20</sup>but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. <sup>21</sup>For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

P: Send now we pray, Your Holy Spirit, the spirit of our Lord and of His resurrection, that we who receive the Lord's body and blood may live to the praise of Your glory and receive our inheritance with all Your saints in light.
